However, we realized that to continue our important work we need to grow and change. It's time to reset and to kick off our year stronger than ever. Therefore, we are reimagining our structure and reinventing our programs. We promise to do our best to make sure we don't have any "bored" meetings. Be sure to join us on Sept. 22 for our kickoff event, which we are calling "Light up the World." We will be making candles, socializing and sharing with you our plans for this coming year. We also want to hear your ideas and goals as we strive for a more collaborative Board experience. As we say in our prayers during Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, there are three paths which ensure that we are "written and sealed" for a year of sweetness and abundance. Teshuvah means a return to one's true innermost good character. Tefillah means attachment and connection with G-d. And tzedakah means righteousness. In other words, a person's possessions are entrusted to her by G-d in order that she justly fulfills her duty and gives to those who are in need. Campaign Update

We are happy to report that so far:

- The **2022** General Campaign has raised \$17.5 million from more than 4,400 donors with a card-for-card increase of 12.77%.
- The Women's Campaign has raised \$5 million from more than 2,300 donors with a card-for-card increase of 15.71%.

We are already running the 2023 Campaign. Please be on the lookout for your new assignments. Give top priority to any assignments still open for 2022. It's a good time to wish donors a Shana Tova and discuss their Jewish commitment. When asking for a pledge, share how their pledge is making an impact by helping the most vulnerable and strengthening Jewish life. In addition, our special campaigns have supported the Ukrainian refugee relief efforts, emergency responses and so much more. We know it's the personal ask that makes a difference in whether someone gives or not. Every gift at every level is important and adds up. It's not just about dollars, but also about number of donors.

WP Mini-Mission

WP recently organized a mini-mission for about a dozen women to take a peek behind the Federation curtain. They toured a few of the local agencies, which included the JCS Kosher Food Bank, Yeshiva Toras Chaim Toras Emes school and the Miami Beach Jewish Community Center. In addition, they participated in a *mitzvah* project over lunch and packaged gifts for children from Jewish Adoption and Family Care Options (JAFCO). The group enjoyed connecting, learning about each other and becoming inspired and informed about Federation's role in our community. We received much positive feedback and hope to do it again. Spotlight on Fran Berrin



How did you become involved with Federation?

I graduated from the University of Florida and moved down to Miami, where I began graduate school at UM. I then worked as a middle school guidance counselor. I had been a History major in college and had always been interested in taking more Judaic Studies classes. I stumbled upon Center for the Advancement of Jewish Education (CAJE) courses, where I met other women from the South Dade area. All of the women in the group soon learned that we had mutual interests. Federation leadership then identified us as a viable group to mentor and become future leadership in the Women's

Division. As women in this new "Southwest Dade" group, we were trained in fundraising and leadership skills that, to this day, I continue to utilize. I was so inspired by the Mission of Federation that I became one of the first Presidents of this group. I had no idea that my interest in history and these CAJE courses would one day lead me to become the President of Women's Philanthropy and years later, the Lion of Judah Endowment Committee (LOJE) Chair.

Why is your involvement important to you?

In the early years, Women's Philanthropy gave me so many opportunities to grow—from programs, workshops, conferences, and travel on the local and national level. But the greatest gift I received was the friendship, camaraderie and encouragement of others to make an impact on improving the lives of others. Now, I am so grateful to have the opportunity to mentor others as I had been mentored early on in my Federation career.

What is a philanthropic accomplishment of yours that you are most proud of?

During my term as President, there was a concerted effort to make certain that women could give their own individual gifts with pride and respect. At the time, women's gifts were not seen as instrumental to the success of the General Campaign. We made the decision to develop categories of giving. For the first time, a new category of \$100,000 (Platinum level) came to fruition. Miami, being the birthplace of the Lion, required us to make the decisions about the gems on the Lion that corresponded to the different levels of giving. I was also extraordinarily proud that during my term, both the Campaign Chair and the President were given a permanent seat on the General Board. This representation was so important for women to be seen as truly equal in the eyes of Federation. Becoming the LOJE Chair, I was tasked with building its program and encouraging women's legacy giving. As a woman leader in Federation, I believe that endowing your Lion is one of the greatest gifts you can give. I am so honored to receive the Kipnis-Wilson/Friedland Award. Norma Kipnis Wilson was both a friend and a mentor. I am humbled to walk in her footsteps and in the footsteps of other inspiring women like her who have
